FIRST READING Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

I have taken the hand of Cyrus to subdue nations before his countenance.

Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to Cyrus, whom he has taken by his right hand to subdue nations before him and strip the loins of kings, to force gateways before him that their gates be closed no more:

It is for the sake of my servant Jacob, of Israel my chosen one, that I have called you by your name, conferring a title though you do not know me.

I am the Lord, unrivalled; there is no other God besides me.

Tell us your opinion then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he replied, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's,' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar - and to God what belongs to God.'

Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

COOPERATING TO SERVE GOD AND HUMANITY

The readings of this Sunday invite us to reflect on our service to God and humanity. In the ancient world especially of monarchies it was not uncommon for rulers to describe themselves as gods. They claimed to possess certain divine qualities and powers too. The people of Israel would never allow their rulers to be called gods. There is only one God the Lord as the affirmed in the Shema. However, in the first reading we hear the Lord, for the sake of his servant Jacob and of Israel his chosen one, giving authority to Cyrus and would later be crucial for Israel's return to their homeland after captivity in Babylon. Here we learn that God realizes His plan for salvation even through people who may not know or believe in Him. For this reason, we as believers should pray for the authorities and also cooperate with them in everything that is good and just, even when they are not believers. Jesus tells us in the Gospel therefore, to "render unto Caesar what belongs to Caesar and unto God what is God's". The Pharisees and Herodians failed to grasp the meaning of Jesus' teaching. Jesus was simply teaching them to assuredly give God His due. Let us remember always, that all that we have and all that we are come from God. As such, in all the worldly realities, we must seek, find, love, honour and give glory to our creator.




