

FIRST READING Malachi 1:14 - 2:2, 8-10

A reading from the prophet Malachi

SECOND READING 1 Thessalonians 2:7-9, 13

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

We were eager to hand over to you not only the Good News but our lives as well.

Like a mother feeding and looking after her own children, we felt so devoted and protective towards you, and had come to love you so much, that we were eager to hand over to you not only the Good News but our whole lives as well. Let me remind you, brothers, how hard we used to work, slaving night and day so as not to be a burden on any one of you while we were proclaiming God's Good news to you.

Another reason why we constantly thank God for you is that as soon as you heard the message that we brought you as God's message, you accepted it for what it really is, God's message and not some human thinking; and it is still a living power among you who believe it.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *They do not practise what they preach.*

Addressing the people and his disciples Jesus said, 'The scribes and the Pharisees occupy the chair of Moses. You must therefore do what they tell you and listen to what they say; but do not be guided by what they do: since they do not practise what they preach. They tie up heavy burdens and lay them on men's shoulders, but will they lift a finger to move them? Not they! Everything they do is done to attract attention, like wearing broader phylacteries and longer tassels, like wanting to take the place of honour at banquets and the front seats in the synagogues, being greeted obsequiously in the market squares and having people call them Rabbi.

'You, however, must not allow yourselves to be called Rabbi, since you have only one Master, and you are all brothers. You must call no one on earth your father, since you have only one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor must you allow yourselves to be called teachers, for you have only one Teacher, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

It was good to welcome Archbishop Fisher home from Rome, where he was attending the Synod throughout October.

A very warm welcome to all our visitors to St Mary's Cathedral this weekend, including Archbishop Paul Gallagher, the Vatican's Secretary for Relations with States, who is paying an official visit to Australia to mark 50 years of diplomatic relations between Australia and the Holy See, and Archbishop Charles Balvo, the Apostolic Nuncio to Australia.

We'll be reminded further of our connection to the Roman Church on Thursday: it is the Feast of the Anniversary of Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, which is actually the Cathedral of Rome and known as *Omnium Urbis and Orbis Ecclesiarum Mater et Caput* – "Mother and Head of all Churches in Rome and in the World".

This feast reawakens our awareness of our fellowship in the Catholic Church, our communion with the Pope and the Roman Church. This communion is more than a visible relationship, it is a spiritual reality and extends beyond this world to the communion of saints – of which we are particularly aware throughout this month of November when we pray for the holy souls in purgatory.

I'd like to mention that Rev. Dr. Emmanuel Lubega, who has been with us in Cathedral House for several years, first as Chaplain to St Vincent's Hospital and more recently as Assistant Priest at the Cathedral, will be moving to Kingsgrove Parish mid November. I want to publicly thank Fr Emmanuel for his ministry among us and wish him well for his new appointment. He will be missed in Cathedral House! Please keep Fr Brendan Purcell in your prayers as he is unwell at present though as cheerful as ever. And while you are praying, kindly remember the Reverends Željko Evetovic and Ronny Jose D'Cruz who are due to be ordained to the priesthood in the cathedral on 4th November. May their ministry be fruitful for the Lord!

There are several of our parishioners who would also appreciate your prayers at this time, because of illness and some other special circumstances. May the Lord bless them and each of you in the week ahead!


Volunteer Accountant/Finance Officer Palms Australia
