*All strike their breast thrice, saying*

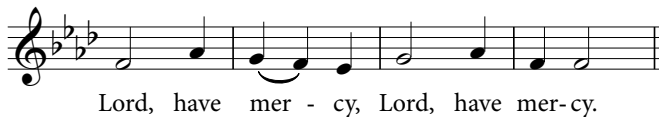

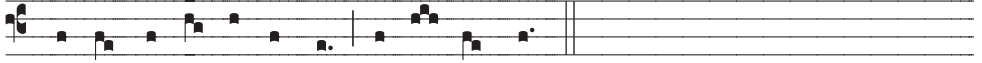

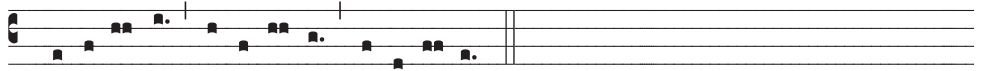

HOMILY

and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

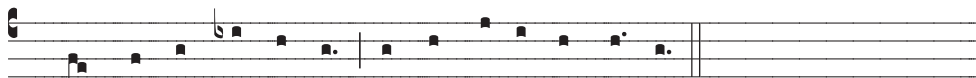
