# THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



#### FIRST READING Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah *Prepare the way for the Lord.* 

'Console my people, console them' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God

across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'

Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

#### RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 84:9-14

*R*. Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation.

I will hear what the Lord God has to say, a voice that speaks of peace, peace for his people. His help is near for those who fear him and his glory will dwell in our land. *R*.

Mercy and faithfulness have met; justice and peace have embraced. Faithfulness shall spring from the earth and justice look down from heaven. *R*.

The Lord will make us prosper and our earth shall yield its fruit. Justice shall march before him and peace shall follow his steps. *R*.

### SECOND READING 2 Peter 3:8-14

A reading from the second letter of St Peter We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the

sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

#### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Luke 3:4, 6

Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

### GOSPEL Mark 1:1-8

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark Make straight the paths of the Lord.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you;

he will prepare your way.

A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord,

make his paths straight,

and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

# WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

Preparations are underway for the opening night of the "Christmas at the Cathedral" evening festival in the square, featuring of course the illuminations on the façade of the cathedral. The theme is the well known song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas", which may also be considered to have Christian doctrinal meanings hidden behind the numbers. These symbols will be carried through into the cathedral's internal decorations.

As part of the musical programme of "Christmas at the Cathedral" there will be different groups performing in the square each night. Be sure not to miss St Mary's Cathedral Choir at 7.30pm on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> December and the St Mary's Singers at 6.30pm on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup>!


I'd like to remind you that the Cathedral Choir will not be putting on a Christmas Concert this year, but instead a very special celebration, "O Emmanuel": a reflection in words and music on the mystery of the Incarnation, with a time of adoration, on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> at 4.30pm. (It will take the place of our usual Sunday Vespers and Benediction.)

Some people have asked me whether, because Christmas is on a Monday this year, they can just go to Mass on Sunday evening, 24<sup>th</sup>, Christmas Eve, to cover both their Sunday and Christmas Mass obligations. The answer is NO! Two obligations (Sunday and Christmas), two Masses! You could, if you chose, go to Mass on the evening of Sunday the 24<sup>th</sup> to fulfil your Sunday obligation, and on the morning of the 25<sup>th</sup> to fulfil your Christmas obligation. Or you could go to Mass on the morning of Sunday to fulfil your Sunday obligation, and to another Mass on Sunday evening celebrated as a Christmas Vigil to fulfil your Christmas obligation. Two obligations, two Masses, no shirking of your responsibilities.

(And anyway Christmas is hardly the time to be making St Nicholas sad by your misbehavior!)

# ST MARY'S CATHEDRAL: MASTERPLAN UPDATE

December 2023





Thank you for your input into the future of St Mary's **Cathedral Precinct** 

During 2023, we have been seeking feedback from parishioners, visitors, Clergy and staff on the vision and draft masterplan for the Cathedral Precinct.

During our most recent conversations in November, we heard strong support for the draft masterplan.

This newsletter is to share your feedback and outline the next steps.

# A MASTERPLAN INFORMED BY YOUR VISION

During our first stage of engagement in mid 2023, we spoke with hundreds of parishioners, volunteers, visitors, clergy and staff about your ideas and aspirations for the future of the Cathedral Precinct.

Based on feedback from nearly 200 respondents, you told us that you support our vision:

*Our vision is to protect and enhance the iconic Cathedral grounds, whilst making these more accessible for everyone.* 

The key findings of the visioning engagement included:

#### The masterplan vision


There is a high level of support for the Cathedral vision with nearly 90% of respondents supportive of the suggested upgrades.

#### **Respecting the heritage**

The Cathedral's rich heritage remains a priority, with 90% of respondents agreeing that heritage is its most important feature.

#### Improved accessibility

Nearly 90% ranked the need for accessible entrances as high or moderate, stating more ramps should be prioritised.



# OUR MASTERPLAN


Following our visioning engagement, we developed a draft master plan to deliver the future vision for St Mary's Cathedral, the spiritual home to Catholic communities across Greater Sydney and NSW.

In November, we again reached out to Parish communities to hear your thoughts on how effectively the draft master plan spoke to our vision and aspirations for the precinct. During our engagement on the Draft Master Plan, we:



#### YOUR FEEDBACK

Most respondents supported the draft masterplan. Key findings of the engagement included:



#### Accessibility upgrades:

81% (n = 83) of respondents believe that the masterplan will make the Cathedral more accessible and more inclusive, by providing facilities that meet the needs of more community members.

# Respect for the heritage of the Cathedral:

71% (n = 76) of respondents believe that the masterplan appropriately respects the heritage of the Cathedral.

## WHAT YOU TOLD US

Most people felt that the masterplan adequately balanced the need to improve the Cathedral's facilities and accessibility whilst retaining the Heritage values of St Mary's Cathedral. You supported:



Improved access, by upgrading the Cathedral to provide accessible entrances and bathrooms.

"I believe careful consideration has been given to the masterplan."


#### OUR NEXT STEPS

#### Caritas Australia's Gaza Crisis Appeal

The sudden escalation of hostilities in Israel and Gaza since 7 October has seen unimaginable impacts for the people affected by this conflict.

The human toll has been devastating with more than 7,000 deaths across Israel and Gaza. Over 5,700 Palestinians have been killed so far, nearly half of them are children, while more than 15,000 people have been injured in Gaza.

Over 1.4 million people (60% of the population) have been displaced in Gaza with immediate food, shelter, health, and psychosocial needs.

Caritas Australia is working with our partner Catholic Relief Services (CRS), providing emergency shelter for over 1,200 people and cash support to over 7,100 families so far. We are also assisting with household items, including mattresses, blankets and other materials and support for food assistance and water, sanitation and hygiene.
