FIRST READING Job 7:1-4, 6-7

A reading from the prophet Job

I am filled with sorrow all day long.

Job began to speak:

Is not man's life on earth nothing more than pressed service, his time no better than hired drudgery?

Like the slave, sighing for the shade, or the workman with no thought but his wages, months of delusion I have assigned to me, nothing for my own but nights of grief.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 146:1-6

R. Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted.

Praise the Lord for he is good; sing to our God for he is loving: to him our praise is due. *R*.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians Punishment will come to me if I do not preach the Gospel.

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it! If I had chosen this work myself, I might have been paid for it, but as I have not, it is a responsibility which has been put into my hands. Do you know what my reward is? WORD FROM OUR NEW CATHEDRAL ASSISTANT PRIEST



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

It's been eleven years since I've been part of the Cathedral. Not as a priest but as a Cathedral Chorister.

I began my time at the Cathedral as an energetic nine-year old in the Choir/College. For twelve years I had the immense privilege of singing in the oldest and finest musical institution in Australia.

It was during this time that, unbeknownst to me, the seeds of the priesthood were quietly growing. Not sure of what to study, after school I decided to study something I would never regret, music.

After a Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Education at UNSW, and through the prayers and friendship of the Catholic Chaplaincy there, I joined the Seminary of the Good Shepherd, Homebush in 2013 and completed my studies in 2019.

I would probably not be a priest today if it wasn't for the many years spent singing God's praises in our beautiful Cathedral. God won me over through beauty.

My message is simple... do not underestimate the power of God.

I was never the most well-behaved boy. I'd even joke around with friends on the sanctuary during Mass! But God decided to take this young jokester and turn him into His priest.

Think God doesn't have a sense of humour? Think of my story.

Think a particular person or situation is beyond help? Again, think of me.

I am here for you, and you are in my prayers, daily.





ABOUT STATIONS OF THE CROSS:

The Stations of the Cross is a special devotion that commemorates the journey of Christ to his Crucifixion and burial.

St Mary's Cathedral has 14 stations arranged in order in which we visit to commemorate and pray. The stations are magnificent oil paintings painted in France, which were acquired by Cardinal Moran in 1885 during a visit to Europe.

The Carrying of the Cross Window – 4th Sorrowful Mystery of the Rosary.

Positioned on the eastern side of the Cathedral. The image depicts Jesus being forced to carry his cross uphill to the place of execution.

Faith leaders reject 'Equality' Bill

THE LEADERS of NSW's major Christian denomina-tions and other faith traditions have joined Archbish-op Anthony Fisher OP in a call for the rejection in full of Sydney MP Alex Greenwich's "Equality" bill, set to be de-

bated when parliament re-turns in early February.

The archbishop put his signature to a document detailing the havoc the bill would wreak on religious freedom in NSW, along-side Anglican Archbishop of Sydney Kanishka Raffel, Imam Shadi Alsuleiman of the National Imams Council

Surinder Jain of the Hindu Council of Australia, and the heads of various Protestant denominations, the Australian Christian Lobby, and NSW Council of Churches.

The heads of major re-ligious schools bodies also signed, including Catholic Schools NSW CEO Dallas McInerney, Christian Schools Australia's Mark Spencer, and Abdullah Khan from Islamic

Schools Australia.
The document was compiled by leading religious freedom think-tank Freedom for Faith, which is encouraging Christians to contact their members of parliament via the contactyourmp.org.au website

20 pieces of legislation, and will remove protections for faith-based schools and institutions that allow them to teach traditional Christian doctrine on controversial subjects, such as marriage and sexuality—along with dozens of other changes.

"There is no safe way of

splitting this bill, or passing parts of it, without risking significant unintended con-sequences," the document

asserts. "Mr Greenwich's bill is extreme, and prioritises the de-sires of one small group over all other parts of society.
