### THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



FIRST READING Jeremiah 31:31-34 (Year B)

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

The days are coming when I will make a new covenant with Israel and I will forgive their iniquity.

See, the days are coming - it is the Lord who speaks - when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive - it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest - it is the Lord who speaks - since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

R. Create a clean heart in me, O God.

for the Son of Man to be glorified.

I tell you, most solemnly,

unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies,

it remains only a single grain;

but if it dies,

it yields a rich harvest.

Anyone who loves his life loses it;

anyone who hates his life in this world

will keep it for the eternal life.

If a man serves me, he must follow me,

wherever I am, my servant will be there too.

If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him.

Now my soul is troubled.

What shall I say:

Father, save me from this hour?

But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour.

Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.

### WORD FROM THE ACTING DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

Happy Sunday!

I hope you're having a blessed Lent.

You would have noticed the covering of the crosses and sacred images throughout the Cathedral. This happens in time for the Fifth Sunday of Lent and the coverings remain until the Easter Vigil. This time, traditionally known as Passiontide, is a time to focus more on Christ who veiled his Divinity during his Passion. He was naked, suffered, and died for us, so that stripped from the comforts of this world we would cling to the saving power of God.

As the First Preface of the Passion of the Lord puts it in the weekdays ahead:

For through the saving Passion of your Son the whole world has received a heart to confess the infinite power of your majesty...

Our hearts are being changed by the Passion of Jesus.

What a joy to have two great Saints to help us push through these final days of Lent before we enter Holy Week.

The Solemnity of St Patrick is transferred to Monday this year and on Tuesday we will celebrate the Solemnity of St Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. I want to encourage you to make a visit to the Irish Saints Chapel inside the Cathedral (right side of the Sanctuary) and the Chapel of St Joseph (back left of the Sanctuary). Even if veiled – ask these Saints to reveal to you what's possible in your life when you say yes to God.

I'm pleased to report that our Dean, Fr Don Richardson, has enjoyed and benefited greatly from his sabbatical experience so far. Whilst he won't be here with us at Easter, he will return to resume his responsibilities at the Cathedral on April 13.

Finally, Dear Parishioners, Volunteers and Staff, I can announce with a heart full of gratitude for the opportunity to meet and minister to you that I am approaching the end of my current appointment at St Mary's Cathedral. It has been an absolute honour and joy to be appointed here as an Assistant Priest and Master of Ceremonies for coming up to five years! And more recently as Acting Dean and Administrator of the Mother Church of Australia I have only grown in my desire to serve as a Pastor of God's people.

Thank you for all the encouragement and strength you have given me by your own faithful witness. I will complete my MC responsibilities on Easter Sunday and my final day at St Mary's Cathedral will be on Sunday, April 14.
Archbishop Anthony has appointed Fr Benjamin Saliba as his new Master of Ceremonies, commencing Easter Monday.
Please be assured of my love and prayers as we prepare for the holiest of weeks ahead and please keep all the clergy in your prayers as we respond to the call of God in our lives.






## **Holy Thursday Visitation of the 7 Churches Pilgrimage**

### **Restoration of Funding for Palliative Care**

Archbishop Fisher has encouraged the faithful to sign a petition calling for a restoration of funding for palliative care.

There has been \$250 million cut from the palliative care budget in NSW, which will have a significant impact on the care people in our state will receive at the end of life.

Given that euthanasia is now legal in NSW, it is even more important that we ensure there are life-affirming options available to those who need it most.

Petition closes on 3 April 2024.




