

All strike their breast thrice, saying



The Celebrant gives the absolution, saying

All repeat each line of the Kyrie, after it has been sung by the Cantor.







When the Celebrant sings


Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.


