St Mary's Cathedral is the Cathedral church of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney and the seat of the Archbishop of Sydney, The Most Reverend Anthony Fisher OP.

It is dedicated to the "Immaculate Mother of God, Help of Christians", Patroness of Australia and holds the title and dignity of a minor basilica, bestowed upon it by Pope Pius XI on 4 August 1932.

Cathedral Facts:

- ❖1821 The foundation stone of the first St Mary's Chapel is laid by Gov. Macquarie and blessed by Fr Therry
- ❖1865 St Mary's Cathedral is destroyed by fire
- 1868 the foundation stone of the present Cathedral is laid
- ❖St Mary's is designed principally in the Geometric Decorated style of Gothic Revival which first evolved around the 13th century
- ❖St Mary's Cathedral is 107 metres (351 ft) in length. The Nave is 24.3 metres (80 ft) wide. The Nave height 22.5 metres (74 ft) and the central tower rises to 46 metres (151ft)
- ❖ Number of spires = 2. Spire height 74.6 metres (245 ft)
- ❖The slope of the land and an apparent error in the 'starting point' of the building on the site necessitated the addition of a flight of more than 30 steps to the front of the building by the architects
- Construction materials used consisted of Sydney sandstone, Oamaru stone, marble, alabaster, Moruya granite
- ❖There are a total of 70 internal access doors and 47 external doors
- ❖The stained glass windows of the Cathedral were made in Birmingham, England at the famous Hardman Studios and were brought to Australia in the late 1880's
- ❖Today the Cathedral's central Moran Tower houses 14 bells. The Bells range in weight with the smallest weighing at 281kg whilst the heaviest weighs 1741kg. Each bell is named after a saint of the Church
- ❖ Another bell is located in the Southern Tower of the Cathedral. The Angelus Bell is one of the original bells of the 1882 peal and is still rung everyday at 12 noon for the Angelus prayer and devotion.
