brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.**

The Celebrant gives the absolution, saying

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

All repeat each line of the KYRIE, after it has been sung by the Cantor.







℟: Amen.

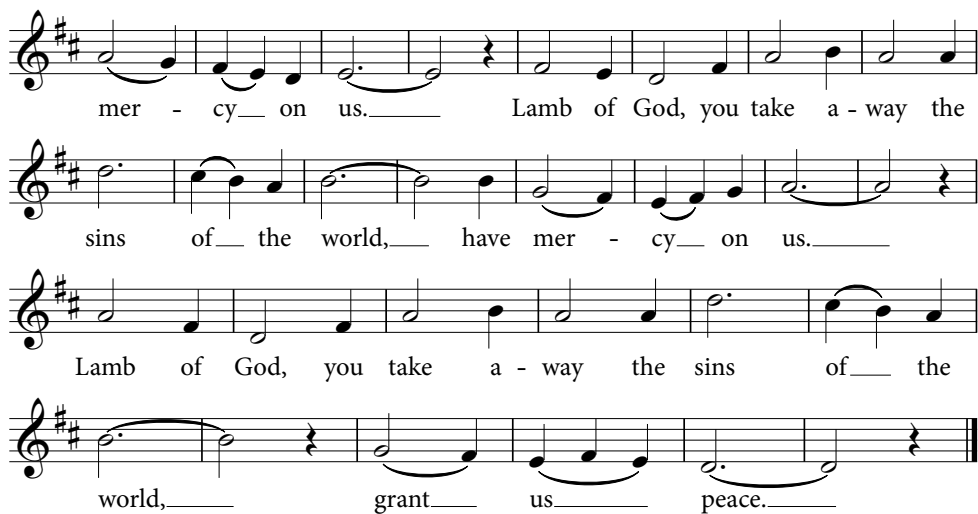

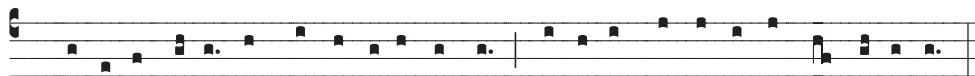


Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

℟: **This is the Body that will be given for you; this is the Chalice of the new covenant.**


I trusted, even when I said: I am sorely afflicted, and when I said in my alarm: No man can be trusted. ℟
