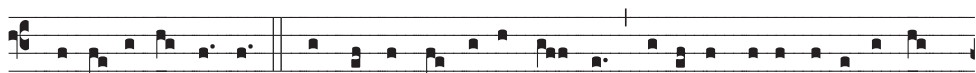

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

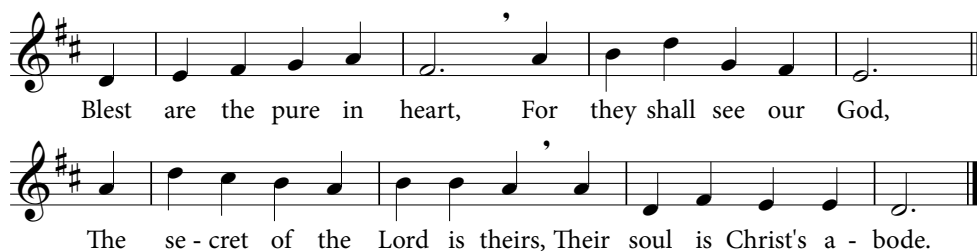
How lovely is your dwelling place, Lord, God of hosts. My soul is longing and yearning, is yearning for the courts of the Lord. ℟.
