

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



FIRST READING Genesis 18:20-32

A reading from the book of Genesis Lord, do not be angry if I speak.

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.'

He said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry if I speak once more: perhaps there will only be ten.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the ten.'

GOSPEL Luke 11:1-13

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *Ask, and it will be given to you.*

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it to him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. what father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors.

I thought people might appreciate an update on some of the works going on in and around the cathedral at present.

The main, southern, doors remain out of use as work continues outside that area to prevent damage to the fabric of the cathedral and crypt from water ingress. This is a time-consuming technical operation, and we do not expect it to be completed before about the end of September.

Work on the upgrading of the sound system and the cameras and other gear we use to livestream the liturgy is also continuing. The sound system in the crypt is also going to be significantly upgraded.

The repairs and maintenance on the Letourneau Organ in the west transept are well underway, and we expect the scaffolding there to be removed around the end of August. It will be lovely to have that area open and bright once again!

High above your heads, the clerestory windows are being restored and repaired one by one, a process that will take several years to finish because there are nearly forty windows to remove, refurbish and reinstall. Another one has just been done and you may soon notice the scaffolding move to the next window.

Meanwhile the celebration of the liturgy and the sacraments, and the pastoral life of the cathedral generally, continues. The numbers attending Sunday Masses especially keep growing and sometimes threaten to overwhelm the small number of ushers, readers and servers that we have, so if you are a regular worshipper at St Mary's please do think about becoming one of our volunteers!




