

All strike their breast thrice, saying



All bow during the following line:


and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.


R. For the kingdom, the power and the glo-ry are yours now and for ev-er.




Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

The sacred host must be consumed in the presence of the communion minister.




#### X You have given us, Lord, bread from heav'n, full of delight and sweetness.
