

All strike their breast thrice, saying







All bow during the following line:


and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

O God, our help in ages past, Our hope for years to come, Be thou our guide while troubles last, And our eternal home.




Ry For the kingdom, the power and the glo-ry are yours now and for ev-er.


