SECOND READING Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-12

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

We will look for the city designed and built by God.

Only faith can guarantee the blessings that we hope for, or prove the existence of the realities that at present remain unseen. It was for faith that our ancestors were commended.

It was by faith that Abraham obeyed the call to set out for a country that was the inheritance given to him and his descendants, and that he set out without knowing where he was going. By faith he arrived, as a foreigner, in the Promised Land, and lived there as if in a strange country, with Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. They lived there in tents while he looked forward to a city founded, designed and built by God.

It was equally by faith that Sarah, in spite of being past the age, was made able to conceive, because she believed that he who had made the promise would be faithful to it. Because of this, there came from one man, and one who was already as good as dead himself, more descendants than could be counted, as many as the stars of heaven or the grains of sand on the seashore.

GOSPEL *Luke 12:32-48*

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *See that you are prepared.*

Jesus said to his disciples: 'There is no need to be afraid, little flock, for it has pleased your Father to give you the kingdom.

'Sell your possessions and give alms. Get yourselves purses that do not wear out, treasure that will not fail you, in heaven where no thief can reach it and no moth destroy it. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

'See that you are dressed for action and have your lamps lit. Be like men waiting for their master to return from the wedding feast, ready to open the door as soon as he comes and knocks. Happy those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. I tell you solemnly, he will put on an apron, sit them down at table and wait on them. It may be in the second watch he comes, or in the third, but happy those servants if he finds them ready. You may be quite sure of this, that if the householder had known at what hour the burglar would come, he would not have let anyone break through the wall of his house. You too must stand ready, because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

Peter said, 'Lord, do you mean this parable for us, or for everyone?' The Lord replied, 'What sort of steward, then, is faithful and wise enough for the master to place him over his household to give them their allowance of food at the proper time? Happy that servant if his master's arrival finds him at this employment. I tell you truly, he will place him over everything he owns. But as for the servant who says to himself, "My master is taking his time coming", and sets about beating the menservants and the maids, and eating and drinking and getting drunk, his master will come on a day he does not expect and at an hour he does not know. The master will cut him off and send him to the same fate as the unfaithful.

'The servant who knows what his master wants, but has not even started to carry out those wishes, will receive very many strokes of the lash. The one who did not know, but deserves to be beaten for what he has done, will receive fewer strokes. When a man has had a great deal given him, a great deal will be demanded of him; when a man has had a great deal given him on trust, even more will be expected of him.'

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors.

I write this message at my desk in the presbytery on Norfolk Island, in the South Pacific, where I have been for the past week. During this pastoral visit I have been discussing with the parishioners how we might make use of technology and the internet to help the faithful in this remotest outpost of the Archdiocese of Sydney to enhance their connection to and participation in Catholic life and worship. As it is winter on Norfolk, there are not so many tourists around at present, but this island with its fascinating history and it's unique community is as beautiful as ever.

A word of acknowledgement to all the runners in the City2Surf race today, Sunday – may they be safe and successful. The Sydney Marathon will take place on Sunday 31st, and several Catholic athletes have requested that we have a blessing for the runners in the Marathon, as happens in cities like New York and Boston. So, the 6pm Mass on Saturday 30th will include a Blessing of Runners, and will be celebrated by Bishop Danny Meagher.

This Friday, the 15th, we will celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which is a Holy Day of Obligation. As it is a working day, the Mass times at the cathedral are intended to let you get to Mass before work, during the lunch break, or after work: 6.45am, 1.10pm and 5.30pm. As usual on a Friday, there will be a Holy Hour with Rosary and Benediction beginning at Noon.

I would also like to mention that Saturday the 16th of August is the anniversary of the death in 1911 of Cardinal Patrick Francis Moran, the third Archbishop of Sydney, and next Sunday 17th is the anniversary of the death in 1883 of the second Archbishop, Roger Bede Vaughan OSB. Both are buried in the cathedral crypt. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace.




A message from the Archdiocese of Sydney:
