

All strike their breast thrice, saying



The Celebrant gives the absolution, saying





We walk by faith, and not by sight: no gracious words we hear of him who spoke as none e'er spoke, but we believe him near.




Ry For the kingdom, the power and the glo-ry are yours now and for ev-er.


### R: May my ways be firm in keeping your statutes.
