





## PROFESSION OF FAITH


Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.


The things we have heard and understood, the things our fathers have told us, these we will not hide from their children but will tell them to the next generation.  $\mathbb{R}$
