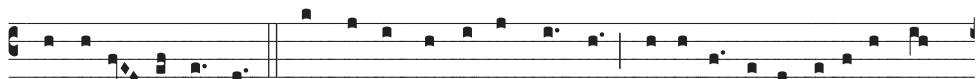

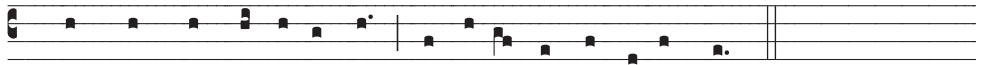

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our dai-ly bread,

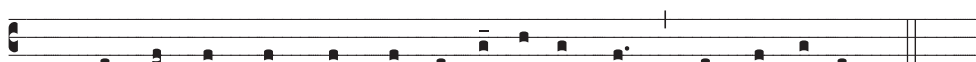


and forgive us our trespasses, as we for-give those who trespass a-gainst us;
