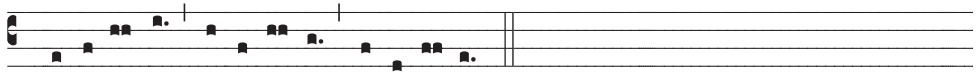

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH
