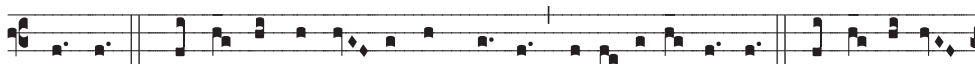

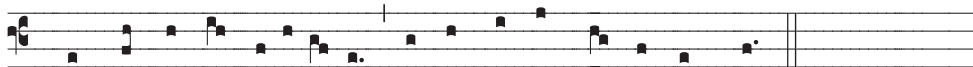

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

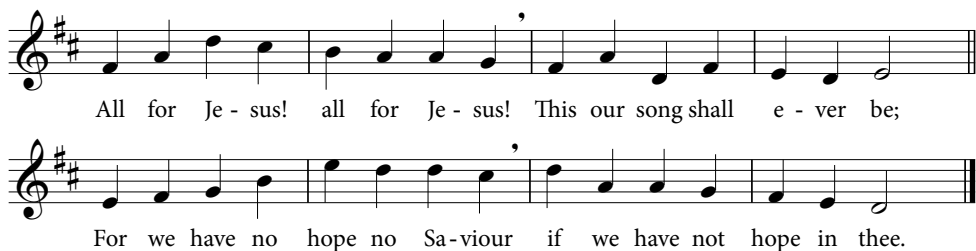
Bless the Lord, my soul! Lord God, how great you are, clothed in majesty and glory, wrapped in light as in a robe! ℟.
