

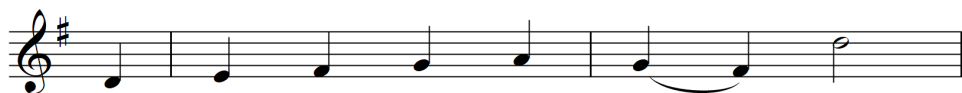

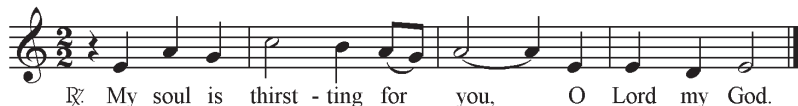
THE LITURGY OF THE WORD
