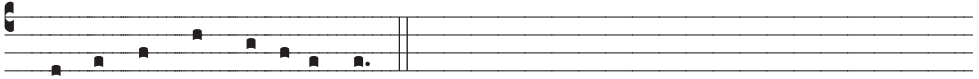

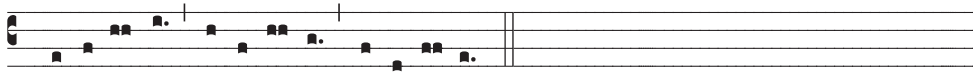

HOMILY

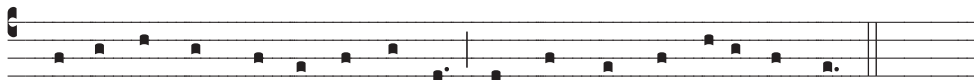
All sing the AGNUS DEI

℞: **Remember your word to your servant, by which you have given me hope.**

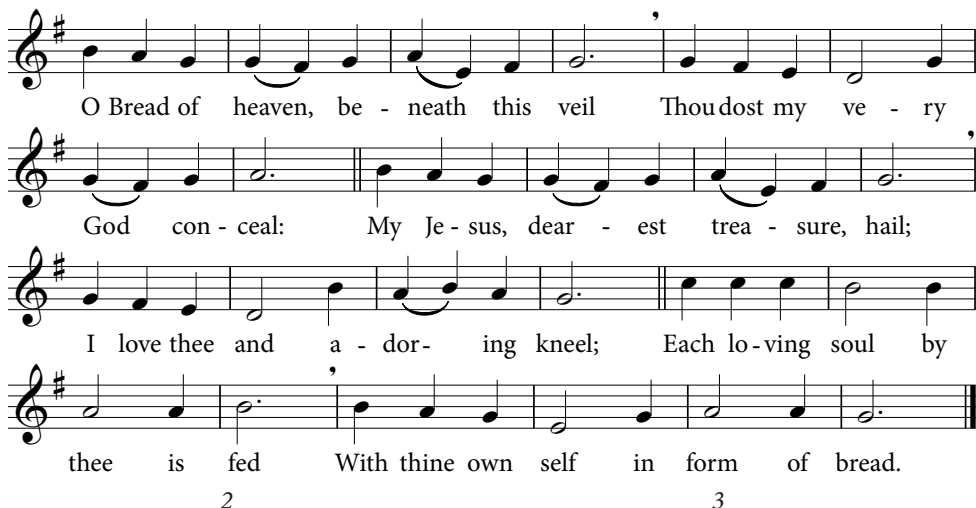
They are happy whose life is blameless, who follow God's law! They are happy who do his will, seeking him with all their hearts. ℞
